B. He dwells in unusual places (the work)

- 1. Haunting original documents...an interpreter without this knowledge is greatly limited
- Consulting the "most-primary" sources. A contradiction in adjectival usage to be sure, but the exegete tries to be a first hand man as much as is possible in every situation.
- Delighting in unusual spots. ... the questions, the difficult places, the argued points.
- C. He thinks "inexpressible thoughts"
 - 1. Regarding the Biblical text:
 - a. inspiration
 - b. transmission
 - c. textual work (lower criticism, etc)
 - 2. Assumes historical reality:
 - a. the Word originated historically
