

New Testament Exegesis: Some key phrases.

1. ΙΟΑΝΝΗΝ 18:36

Ἡ βασιλεῖα ἡ ἐμὴ οὐκ ἔστιν ἐκ τοῦ κόσμου τούτου

2. ΚΟΡΙΝΘΙΟΥΣ Α 11:15

ὅτι ἡ κόμη ἀντὶ περιβολαίου δέδοται

3. ΙΑΚΩΒΟΥ 2:22

καὶ ἐκ τῶν ἔργων ἡ πίστις ἐτελειώθη

4. ΡΟΜΑΙΟΥΣ 12:4

παραστήσαι τὰ σώματα ὑμῶν θυσίαν ζῶσαν

5. ΙΟΑΝΝΗΝ 14:28

ὅτι ὁ πατὴρ μείζων μου ἐστίν.

Each of the above phrases represents the sort of thing that happens when someone comes to you and says: "I wonder if you can tell me what something means in the Bible. It's just a few words and I can't seem....."

You may have a dedicated theologian with an axe to grind or you may have a truly concerned and confused Christian. You may have a cultist, in fact.

So for each of the above statements, offer an exegesis. Be sure to consider the context, etc. Note also those interesting items in Greek with which we have been working.

Just for fun...ask yourselves what sort of group each question is likely to come from.
