You will quickly see that there is hardly a body known historically that has not been affected in one way or another. Even to the smallest groups (such as the 7th Day Baptists) the concept of liberalistic theology has sought to intertwine itself with the true faith.

Today we do see a resurgence of the evangelical position. In many areas it is hard to see what it will eventually produce in the older orders or how the major bodies will deal with it. So far the most positive assessments have shown the development of a number of newer and more committed bodies.
