

something of the horsemen that are expressed in Zechariah. Merely showing in the first eight verses and there the vision ends in Zechariah 6, merely showing in the first eight verses that God has complete control of the universe, that the power of disease,^{that} the power of death, that the power of destruction, that the power of blessing, are all in the hands of God, and it points out this great central truth, God is able, God is powerful, God will execute His will. Now we have passed rather rapidly over these visions, so let me summarize in essence what their relevancy to us is today. You read these things and they seem like they are written to Jewish people who lived hundreds of years ago, and maybe at firsthand glance, their importance doesn't occur to you, but here's what they bear out in specific detail. They point out that God is supreme and His will is all-important, that no matter what else you have to do, or^{what} else you want to accomplish, that the first and foremost thing is the will of a Holy God, who lays it out in bold relief before you. Lays out in the same time that work done for Him is never done in vain, but when your energies by the Spirit are expended for God, no matter what other people think, no matter what other people do, no matter what happens one way or another, that work is honored by God, it is not done in vain. It points out at the same time that God does not forget you, or does not know what your difficulties are. If the temple lies empty 13 years, God hasn't forgotten about it. God will yet work when you are ready to do His will. It points out at the same time that God is faithful to redeem his people from sin and to cleanse them and to keep them for His glory. It points out as well the famous truth of 2 Corinthians 10, that His grace is sufficient for every need. Where is the power coming
