they are done according to the Word of God, and from your hearts. Because the primacy of God is always on heart worship and on heart religion, and I use the word religion in that sense the adoration of God. Now. In verse 10 continuing, in verse 16, these are the things that ye shall do: if you want God's pleasure in the day in which you live. Speak ye every man the truth to his neighbor and execute the judgment of truth and peace in your gates. It sounds just like Chapter 7, doesn't it? It's practically the same thing. The nature of God doesn't change, the desire of God doesn't change. He wants the heart that's pure before Him, in every age and in every dispensation. Let none of you imagine evil in your hearts against his neighbor, love no false oath: for all these things I hate, saith the Lord. Here's the temple rebuilding process. From the first six chapters, Zechariah lays down the

the temple he rebuilt, but it's God will that your heart be right with Him more than anything else. The building of a temple, the giving of a fast, the execution of the law, anything, if it isn't done unto our God, says Zechariah, does not have the right emphasis. I tell you this is a challenging verse to me. My wife one time, months ago, in a fit of sleeplessness, was up reading from the book of Isaiah, and she said to me the next morning, she said, I'd like to be a preacher, or words to that effect, I don't think she'd really like to be a preacher, but I'd like to preach a few sermons, she said, and she'd been reading in Isaiah 1, and she said, I'd make one of them, why do you go to church, and of course thereby she would have offended just about everybody in the congregation. My wife has come back so I can say these things with a clear
