

Negatively we need to note that:

- the sacrifices did not put away sin
- the sacrifices as mere physical things did not placate God
- the sacrifices were not designed as remedies for the rebellion or hardness of the people
- the sacrifices were not a substitute for the purity of the heart required by God.

The completion of the sacrifices and the priesthood are discussed at rather great length in the book of Hebrews.

2. Sacrificial terms

a. Those describing the offerings:

Burnt
Meal
Peace
Sin
Trespass

b. Those describing the methods:

Fire
Drink
Incense
Wave
Heave

c. Those describing offering characteristics:

willing
sweet savor, etc.

3. Factors in sacrifice:

a. Items common to all sacrifices:

presentation
identification
destruction
demonstration
consummation.

b. Items peculiar depending of the particular order:

selection
appropriation
method
disposal

Other terms and ideas may arise but these are basic. And you will need to remember always that it is not the death that interests God but the life...hence the concept of a living sacrifice in the New Testament is very graphic and important.
