

The trespass offering makes for a workable arrangement among people and provides not only for forgiveness but for acceptance and peace.

9. Summary Notes on the Offerings and the Sacrificial ground for holiness

- a. Christ is the ultimate fulfillment of them all:
 - (1) Burnt Offering: wholly offered to God, Heb. 9
 - (2) Meal Offering: "Lo, I come..." Hebrews 10
 - (3) Peace Offering: "has made peace for us" Ephesians 2
 - (4) Sin Offering: Isa. 53:10
 - (5) Trespass Offering: Isa. 53:5

- b. Through the offerings we learn of Christ (and should apply to ourselves):
 - (1) willingness
 - (2) perfection
 - (3) dedication
 - (4) substitution
 - (5) atonementand forgiveness!

- c. For ourselves we learn:
 - (1) The need of sacrifice
 - (2) The availability of sacrifice
 - (3) The conditions of sacrifice
 - (4) The results of sacrifice
 - (5) The blessings of sacrifice

- d. And we get some spiritual lessons:
 - (1) the desired nature of worship
 - (2) the requirements of the will of God
 - (3) the realization of responsibility
 - (4) the excessive greatness of God's care
 - (5) The importance of blood!

- e. And we also gain some practical lessons in the spheres of:
 - (1) fellowship
 - (2) dedication
 - (3) avoiding sinful conflicts
 - (4) thankfulness.

And in concluding this section we will remind ourselves that
"without holiness no man shall see God"
and in our own parlance
without sacrifice there is no holiness.

And note that chapter 7 offers a recapitulation with a few explanatory notes on the offerings as given. I will offer no separate breakdown of that chapter.
