

The content of the chapter is built around the expression "I am the Lord" and similar references. The idea is that the Lord is the immediate supervisor over all the details and relationships of life. Consequently the adequacy,,, or lack thereof, of our holiness is seen in our living with others under the direction of God. Our analysis of the chapter follows this arrangement.
