

Many scholars think the Galatian letter was written during or at the conclusion of the first missionary journey. Most agree that the letter to the Thessalonians was written on the second journey while Paul was at Corinth in Acts 18.

--Rome burned in summer of 64  
--According to Eusebius, Paul was beheaded in the Neroine persecution following the burning of Rome. Peter, by tradition, was crucified upside down. With a fiend the capacity of Nero, anything is possible.
