"forgotten book of the New Testament." Why do you think this is? Read the articles on Corinth, II Corinthians, and Paul in a Bible dictionary or encyclopaedia for further history and background. Using the passages in Acts and 1 Corinthians, try to reconstruct Paul's motives for writing II Corinthians and his emotions while doing so. How does this help explain the sudden changes of subject and tone in II Corinthians?

Outline Paul's doctrinal teachings in this book. Which receives the most space? Why? How does it apply to the stituation in the Corinthian church? What picture of Paul is revealed by the many references to his own feelings for and relationship to the church at Corinth.
