Source of Revelation: God

Time of Revelation:	in sundry times	in these last days
Manner of Revelation:	having spoken	hath spoken
Address of Revelation:	to the fathers	unto us
Means of Revelation:	by the prophets in diverse manners	by His Son who sat down.

In other words the passage shows us the completness and the finality of the Lord's work. Hebrews 11:6 is a similar key and the note that faith is always what is required of God. And 12:1-2 enable us to see the character and guidelines of Christian life in a very emphatic and positive sense.

Study Tips

You will do well to read Hebrews through at a single sitting and simply try to pick up on the general flow of the argument of the book. Note in particular any Old Testament ideas with which you are not familiar and look these up in a Dictionary or encyclopaedia. Read the warning sections (2:1-6, 4:1-11; 5:1-6; etc.,) and notice carefully about what we are advised. Read the book another time making a note of all the Old Testament quotations. See how these are used and what is apparent about the unity of Scripture in your observation.
