II. Content summary

- A. Overall theme: Apostolic authority is exercised in godly concern for the health of the church (and it can be said with less words)
- B. The introduction: Note the stress words..see the emphasis on the comforting that comes as a result of tribulation and how those who share in grief are able to share in healing. The great giver of health is God. The introduction is built on a realization of the overcoming of a grievous situation and anticipates a state of health as a result.
