1. All students:

a. An overall outline of the section

b. Expository teaching outlines for the entire passage as you may divide it..thinking in terms of 45 minute classes. These are due chapter by chapter after we finish the class discussion. The outlines on chapter 17 will be due at the final examination.

c. Reading of the section once a week throughout the quarter.

2. English Bible students:

Advance preparation of 10 questions on each section as we come to it. These are to be thought questions determined to help bring out the meaning of the passage. They are due in class on the day of assignment and will be collected and evaluated at that pace.

3. Greek Exegesis students:

a. Translation of the entire passage at the rate in which it is studied in class.
