- --Know the names of the Greek tenses, moods and voices and understand basically what is indicated by each.
- --You do not need to know the meanings and uses of the tenses but should have this material for reference if needed.
- --Add the vocabulary words at the end of the lesson to your vocabulary list. Know them all thoroughly.

And, incidentally, as you read alound with your "buddy" listen for words that sound like English words. There is about a twenty-five percent correspondence between Greek and English although, I confess, at times you must listen very closely to pick it up.
