--learning to observe forms of parallelism, chiasm, and the importance of historical data in the Psalter.

--noting the inductive system of Bible study with advantages and disadvantages.

--becoming familiar with the classification of psalms and the particular genius of the Messianic Psalms.

--studying selected metrical psalm arrangements and noting modern adaptations.

1. Term Assignments

- a. Read the Book of Psalms twice. (Use whatever version of the Bible you use for your personal and devotional study..but, please, not a paraphrase.)

 --Write a specific statement as to how each Psalm is applicable to our present spiritual life.  
 --Categorize your psalms into meaningful groups..I will discuss this in class.
