

observation is the first step in your study (p. 6). It must not be hurried so read and re-read, read as a whole and read in parts. (Suggestions will come in class). Identify all the parts of the Psalm. You will not see some of the things noticed on the chart (p. 19) in a quick or cursory reading but you will see them and others as you read and observe. Note how the chart is sectioned to demonstrate observation, interpretation, and application.

If you don't seem to pick this up quickly, please don't feel discouraged for as you continue to think through the Scriptures prayerfully your powers will improve. Patience and effort bring a full reward.

- II. Prepare an analytical chart of your own for Psalm 6.
- III. Note the structure of Psalm 8 as observed on p. 27. See the character of the "envelope" structure. It could touch on just a few verses of a Psalm or even a few phrases as well as the entire psalm.
