Book I ----Psalms 1-41
Book II ---Psalms 42-72
Book III --Psalms 73-89
Book IV ---Psalms 90-106
Book V ----Psalms 107-150
b. Some suggested reasons for this arrangement:
c. Some Psalm numbering eccentricities:
--The Hebrew Bible and most Protestant Bibles number 150 Psalms consecutively.
--The Orthodox Bibles follow this numbering ( $\left.\mathcal{T}, Q_{\text {G }}\right)$
with a total of 151 Psalms (LXX)
Ps $9=9$ \& 10 in Heb. Bible
Ps $113=114-115$ in Heb. Bible Ps 114-115 =116 in Heb. Bible Ps 146-147 =147 in Heb. Bible Add Psalm 151.
