1. Psalm 34

This is one of those psalms where the background is designated and it adds considerable interest to an understanding of the work. It even puts a new slant on the concept of deliverance.

Two stanzas are apparent: 1-10, 11-22.
 Note the development of each:

1-3 Invitation to praise	11-14 Invitation to learn
4-7 Personal Testimony	15-21 Observed Testimony
8-10 Invitation to Trust	22 Invitation to Trust.
