

C. The House of Jason: Acts 17:1-9

1. This is a limited example and there are several similar ones in Acts (limited meaning we do not have a lot of material) and this one seems typical.
2. Note in the text that he was willing to hazard all for the promotion of the Gospel. See how he accorded help to the Apostles:
 - a. He received them
 - b. He sheltered them
 - c. He went bond for them!
3. The point is that Jason valued the testimony and service of God even if such action was detrimental to his personal affairs.
