## C. The House of Jason: Acts 17:1-9

- This is a limited example and there are several similar ones in Acts (limited meaning we do not have a lot of material) and this one seems typical.
- 2. Note in the text that he was willing to hazard all for the promotion of the Gospel. See how he accorded help to the Apostles:
  - a. He received them
  - b. He sheltered them
  - c. He went bond for them!
- 3. The point is that Jason valued the testimony and service of God even if such action was detrimental to his personal affairs.
