- 1. The importance of growth
- 2. "By grace are you saved" Ephesians 2
- 3. There is grace available for every need or trial 1 Peter 5:10 2 Corinthians 12:9
- 4. Grace is a gift and is cultivated by love and obedience

## D. Conclusion

Growth and spirituality are hard to measure in ourselves and others. The best measuring in my opinion lies in the matter of worship, commitment, and obedience to the known will of God: the Scriptures.

But as we are alive we are enabled to live in the new season and to see it develop the testimony of God. The new season is encouraged by the present...as it shows how our lives may honor the Lord who has called us to Himself.

## IV. A New Season: Challenged by the Future: Hebrews 12:1-14

## A. Introducing our discussion:
