- d. The interaction of personality:
  - (1) Suffers rejection and grief...Isa. 63:10, Eph. 4
  - (2) Treated with despite... Heb. 10:29
  - (3) Suffers from untruth...Acts. 5:3
  - (4) Blasphemed....Matt. 12:3, 32
  - (5) Enjoys practice of fellowship...2 Cor. 13:14

This may seem unnecessary in our circles but it is important that we think of the Spirit of God as "personality" and not "thing". This is more important than we can stress both for ourselves and for those with whom we have to do. Might add that every standard work of theology will offer notes similar to these...but unless one studies them and boils them out in living relationships, they are likely to be just words.

- 2. The Divine nature of the personality of the H oly Spirit.
