- c. What does it mean:
  - (1) dependable
  - (2) accurage
  - (3) specific
  - (4) complete
- d. What does it not mean:
  - (1) not necessarily dictation
  - (2) only the ideas are valid
  - (3) the laws of literature or language are to be ignored.

e. The original manuscripts (autographs) are the intended areas for the concept of inspiration. The copies (apographs) are good, very good, but are not the immediate subjects of inspiration. That is an important distinctive that must be borne in mind in all discussions about the character of the Bible.
