If you don't have at least -- Now, I personally think prophecy is being fulfilled day by day but I urge caution on the seeing the fulfillment of those things. (I may be overly cautious; I may bend the other way. But I read a book just last night, and Monday -- I will have a bibliography tomorrow -- I wasn't going to do that, but I am not going to be outdone by a New Testament professor who gives out a bibliography of 6 or 7 books _____ only have 8 or 9! ____ Whatever the case is ! I read a book just the other night -- I mean in preparation for this particular thing; I had read it perhaps 20 years ago, and written in 1933 -- He sees a lot of things fulfilled specifically in 1933 which, if that book were written today, would have been seen fulfilled in 1963 or '65. Well, they are obviously not fulfilled over and over again every 30 years, and so the result is, there are many things under 3. Just be very, very careful about a thing.
