

1. The unfulfillment -- I have only seen there are -- It isn't like there are hundreds of them. Did you get that as you went along? 3. The restoration of Egypt.

If a 1200 year gap is seen in Ezekiel 20 and Ezekiel 30 -- if a 1200 year gap is seen there between the accomplishment of the punishment and the dispersal, then it may be that you actually have a prophetic picture in which the three things, the punishment, the dispersion and the restoration are widely separated times.

Mr. Varner: Would you say that the dispersion is the Moslem conquest?

Mr. Taylor: Well, I haven't said that, but I may be headed that way. I may be headed that way. The fact of the matter is that hardly any Egyptian culture today can trace its steps beyond the Moslem conquest -- beyond the Arab conquest -- hardly any can. About the only thing left are the Pharoahs. If their wives had one of the big patios, I mean, the pyramids. Hardly anything else. So I may be headed there, but you may never know --
