

--Although it grew rapidly in the colonial period and in the early part of the 19th century, the Presbyterian church has not been growing well in the last decades and has lost a total of nearly a million members in the last decade (approximately).

--It has contributed theologians and workers to the church at large in great numbers...evangelists included everyone from Finney to Chapman, Sunday, and R.A. Torrey. And the missions work in Korea and the Cameroons are case book studies on effective service.
