THE PHILOSOPHIES OF HISTORY

Basically three philosophies of history are witnessed in such studies...although there are variations on all of these.

The <u>first</u> is known as the LINEAR approach and is associated with the church father, Augustine, and others. It suggests that history is a continuous progressive matter and is outlined or diagrammed simply by a straight line...from beginning to end. It looks like this:

To Christians the guiding force is God. To Stoics it would be a benevolent fatalism, etc.

The <u>second</u> is designated the CYCLIC view in which history repeats itself along given cycles. The representation looks a little bit like this.

Well, the circle may be a bit whopper-jawed but that is the idea and it is associated historically with Spengler and in the modern age with Toynbee.

The <u>third</u> system is referred to as CONIC and is suggestive of a system in which history repeats itself like a line encircling and ascending a cone. The beginning is the founding of the world by God, the peak is when God draws all things to completion. The cylcles repeat but on a reduced frequency basis as one approaches the peak of the cone. The view is associated in our day with Montgomery and others and is crudely drawn at the left.
