- Johnson, Paul. A HISTORY OF CHRISTIANITY. New York: Athanaeum, 1980. (One of the most interesting one-volume works in print. Johnson writes from an "enlightened" Roman Catholic perception--the term is mine--and although a bit negative gives a very comprehensive and interesting work.)
- LaTourette, Kenneth S. A HISTORY OF THE EXPANSION OF CHRISTIANITY. New York: Harper and Row, 1967. (Particularly helpful in seeing the growth of the church in a missions perspective.)
- McSorley, Joseph: AN OUTLINE OF THE CHURCH BY CENTUR-IES. St. Louis: B. Herder Book Co., 1944. (A work of a Roman author with all the imprimaturs in place...interesting for interpretation and understanding.)
- Schaaf, Philip. A HISTORY OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH. New York: Charles Scribner's Sons, 1949. (Very interestingly written and showing Schaaf's graphic approach to controversy and detail. It has gone through many publications.)
- Shelly, Bruce L. CHURCH HISTORY IN PLAIN LANGUAGE. Waco: Word Books, 1982. (A happy one-volume text with charts, illustrations, chronologies, and even a clever story at times. Shelly is at Denver --Conservative Baptist--and this is a good starter in the field.
- Qualben, Lars P. A HISTORY OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH. New York: Nelson and Sons, 1942. (Sorry I have muffed the alphabetic arrangement...but what can one expect in a Taylor syllabus. A very salutary work packed with a lot of material and study questions in just a few pages.
