And many of these items begun in the interest of integrity, would prove to be genuing problems in just a few years.

Foreword:

Our periodization has been explained earlier and we are moving into the age of decline of the church and almost everything else. Eventually the temporal power of the church will increase dramatically and the spiritual power will virtually disappear. This period moves us through the Dark Ages and to the eve of the Renaissance. In it we move away progressively from the eastern church, not that it is unimportant but that it is not the primary field of our work and interest, and watch the growth of Rome...out of the ruins of the empire and into the power of a solid monarchial institution with all the depravity and intrigue that mark such things.
