One of the larger achievements of this policy is the movement known as the Crusades. But few really positive things developed. The bishops of Rome regularly sought the election of a monarch whome they hoped to manipulate and the men who sought the office most vigorously often did so for less that ideal motivations. Interference with national governments did not help them and governmental dabbling in the church did not aid it either. But the die was cast and the effective relationship of church and state would follow in the mold for centuries to come. In the reformation the jealousy of the Emperor and Bishop will be one of the decisive factors preventing an overthrow of the Reformers by political force. So it is that many of the things set up by men to aid their own ends are diverted by God and used for His purposes.

The Empire will practically end after the Napoleonic wars but some vestiges of it hung on in the Austro-Hungarian empire until the days of Maria Theresa and the conflagration of world war I.

The Life of the Church in this period

Continuing Ecumenical Councils
