c. A few prominent visitors

(1) Zinzendorf, always interested in an evangelical ecumenism...his visit lasted about a year but he had a considerable impact in the European-attached churches.

(2) Whitefield, competent Gospel preacher visited the colonies seven times...supervised an orphanage work in Georgia and served the Great Awakening well...although his forthright and demonstrative style did not please all...you may believe it.

(3) Wesley..a short visit to do mission work among the Indians of the south undertaken before his own personal conversion...but he had the Christian reputation and Whitefield himself had urged Wesley to come.
