- (4) aggrandizement (5) social distress
- (6) revolution (7) interregnum..and then we go through it again.

c. The Conic Approach

Associated with Montgomery, et al, in our day, see history as repeating itself like a road going up a cone (around a mountain) with the climax coming at the peak when God orders things for himself at the close of the times. In this case history repeats on a progressive pattern, charted a little bit like this:

You can guess who is not good at art work.

2. The Components of history

History is composed essentially of:

- a. written records
- b. cultural developments
- c. oral and traditional materials
- d. interpretations of both of the above.. contemporary and reflective
- reconstructions including hypotheses and correction.
