

Leo of Rome: one of the most important bishops of Rome throughout its history: theologian, leader, etc...authored the famed "Tome" that set the pace for Chalcedon.

John of Damascus: Author of a systematic theology in the fashion of that day.. "The Fountain of Knowledge"..decisive in the Second Nicene Counsel..posthumously decisive, that is.

John Chrysostom: Famed preacher of Constantinople and leader in the grammatical/historical interpretation mode. Fearless in his denunciation of sin in higher places.
