- Relationship with the rest of the Bible:
 - a. Exodus provides the content fundamental to Israel's understanding of its history and destiny.
 - b. It offers a classic portrait of the redemption program showing in detail:
 - (1) bondage
 - (2) deliverance
 - (3) guidance
 - (4) fellowship
 - c. Thus with the rest of the Pentateuch books it displays the reality of God's care for His people and His ability to make that reality meaningful.
- C. A somewhat extended outline of Exodus..and there are many ways of outlining a book. Our study does not exactly follow an outline in detail...it moves more by sections but an outline is needed for any overall mastery of content so here is a somewhat extended version.
