- D. An example of Rebellion 32-34..in process, in judgment and in prescription for the future.
 - 1. In the arrangement of this section, 32:1 returns to the narration of 24:18. The intervening chapters are given to show the plan and intent of God and to let us see a little bit of the transaction on the mountain. But now we are back in the sequence of events of the movement of the people of Israel.
 - 2. The creation of the Golden calf 32:1-6

It is a bad day in Israelite history..note the role of the people, the poor judgment of Aaron and the significance of the 40 days.

- 3. The Lord informs Moses 32:7-14
- 4. Moses confronts the situation 32:15-35
 - a. The return to the camp 15-24
 - (1) The tablets broken 19
 - (2) the calf destroyed 20
 - (3) the excuse of Aaron 21ff Note Aaron's description of the people!
 - b. The judgment opf God 25-35
 - (1) Judgment by Levi 25ff
 - (2) Moses' intercession 30 ff
 - (3) Plagues by the Lord 35
 The prayer of Moses, not the first nor
 the last, is one of the remarkable
 moments in the Old Testament. Note in
 particular 32:32..it will make you think
 of Paul's desire for Israel in the New
 Testament
- 5. Planning for the advance move..33:1-23
 - a. The instruction 32:1-3
 - b. National lament 32:4 ff.

The lament is issued in light of the fact that the Lord said He would send them but He would not go with them.

- c. Moses intercedes again 12 ff and God promises to go. See vs. 14..another moving verse.
- d. God manifests himself to Moses 18-23
