## B. The Course Objectives

- 1. To familiarize the student with the basic elements of biblical Hebrew including knowledge of the alphabet, pronounciation, and the special meanings of grammatical/syntactical forms.
- 2. To enable the student to use Hebrew language tools such as the lexicon, concordance, word-study books, etc., and to understand the technical terms that arise in commentaries.
- 3. To demonstrate to the student the services offered by Hebrew and the knowledge thereof and to encourage the student to a deeper study of the biblical languages.
- 4. To help the student participate more fully in basic theological courses where a general understanding of the original languages is deemed helpful.

## C. Steps taken to the fulfilling of the objectives

- 1. Use of materials especially prepared for this class and intense drilling with this stuff!
- 2. Memorization of some portions of Hebrew for help in pronouncing and greater familiarity with the general subject.
- 3. Lectures and discussions on the formation of Hebrew units and the understanding they supply to the biblical text.
- 4. Drilling and reviewing assigned materials.
- 5. Probable use of a "buddy system" (just like they use at the lakes so no one drowns by oneself!) although that is not really decided at this time. If we do it I will explain it clearly and you will enjoy that much of the course.

## D. The Way in which progress is measured:

- 1. Endless periodic quizzes over assigned work!
- Class participation and recitation.
- Appropriate exams and grading of homework as is required in the passing of time.
