

3. The letter Waw ׀ is presently pronounced "vav" although undoubtedly the ancient way of saying it was with the bilabial. I will probably never get over this so be prepared.
4. The letter Tau ט is presently pronounced Tav and the same concept applies as is mentioned above.
5. The gutturals are all hard in Hebrew and they are: Aleph א  
He ה  
Heth ח  
Ayin ע
6. The letters Aleph, א He, ה Heth, ח Ayin ע and Resh ר may not be doubled.
7. And here are some lines of Hebrew to run through just naming the letters. I know we have not had much time to learn them so read with me and enjoy yourself.
