

--STRONG'S EXHAUSTIVE CONCORDANCE...lists words used in English translation and identifies them with a number. This number refers to an appendix at the end of the volume and at the number gives the Hebrew word which you can then look up for fuller usage and understanding in the Lexicon.

Be sure in the selection of a concordance that you have one prepared for the Bible you use for your study. There is practically a concordance for every English translation version today...just make sure you have the right one...and they follow the general pattern of Young and Strong.

Beginners are often amazed at how one Hebrew word may be translated by 1 to 15 English words. But this is the study of language. You can use these two lexicons if you never had this course but you cannot go behind them to the Hebrew studies without this sort of information and the things being done in this class. It is another reason why you must know the Hebrew alphabet mighty well.

And here are some Hebrew concordances in which every thing is Hebrew:

Lisowski: CONCORDANCE OF THE HEBREW OLD TESTAMENT.

ENGLISHMAN'S HEBREW AND CHALDEE CONCORDANCE... will be more useful to you than Lisowski since the context and definitions are in English while the word discussed is shown in Hebrew and in transliterated English.

Mandelkern: HEBREW LEXICON...but with a concordance value. In print and affordable at my last information.
