## II. Sectional Studies of the Gospel of Matthew

(These are treated in a common way in our study. First we raise some general questions by a perusal of the text and then we discuss the text on a segment by segment fashion. Finally we offer some conclusions and observations.)

- A. Meeting the King: Matthew 1-4
  - 1. Some questions from the text in general:
    - a. Why is the genealogy given (ch. 1)
    - b. What are some lessons learned from the genealogy (ch. 1)
    - c. Who were the wise men (ch. 2)
    - d. Who was John the Baptist (3)
    - e. Where does the teaching of baptism originate (ch. 3)
    - f. How is Jesus authenticated for his ministry at His baptism? (3)
    - g. What is the purpose of the temptation (ch. 4)
    - h. What is the nature of the temptation (4)

i. Why does Jesus begin a ministry in Capernaum (4).

> No doubt many other questions arise and these are simply thought questions to make us think about the text. Some of them are essentially rhetorical.

## 2. Particular segments:

a. The generations (genealogy) 1:1-17

- (1) Note the countings --14 generations-and observe from 1:17 that the list is more a mnemonic device than a precise list of all in the family that preceded Joseph.
- (2) Note particularly vss 5, 6, 8
- (3) Note vs. 11

And this genealogy needs eventual comparison with the one given in Luke..but not now!
