

c. Particular segments:

- (1) Reaction of the multitude 21:1-11; 45-46; 22:45. Note the fulfillment of the Old Testament.

How can we understand the fickle nature of the crowd..how could the multitudes shout "Hosannah" with one breath and "crucify Him" with the next.

When we have analyzed this we may be able to see some of the more graphic elements that enter into our own spiritual experience.

- (2) The questions of chapter 22

Note how "all groups" participate

Note the character of the Lord's answers: v. 21, 32, 40.

- (3) The anger of God, ch. 23

Note the contrast of attitude between the Lord's followers and His foes.

Note how an artificial understanding of important things can confuse one's value system ..vs. 16

Note what is really involved in the fulfilling of the law.

And note how hypocrisy makes it not only unlikely that we can help others but also cannot help ourselves.

Note the scope of the error (35) and the inability of men in general to identify themselves properly in their sin (30).
