taught, how can we understand His rejection? Here are some factors of help:

- (1) religious jealousy
- (2) failure to understand the promise and ways of God
- (3) continued resistance to the known truth of God
- (4) prophetic realities/necessities

Nevertheless, remember that many did believe and many accepted Him in the role which was His as King. but King in the heart until some fuller manifestation of the kingdom would come.

How shall we present the Lord Jesus to
our generation?

F. The King: His Promised Return Matthew 24-25

- 1. Some questions:
 - a. What are the questions in 24:3
 - b. What is the prophetic significance of 24:28?
 - c. What is the "generation" of 24:34
 - d. What is the plain teaching of the parable of the virgins?
 - e. What application do we make to ourselves of the account of the talents?
 - f. What is the condition that determines whether one is a "sheep" or a "goat"?

We may as well admit that these questions are not all answered in agreement by all and we may not be able to come to final answers for them so we will just wait. But no one needs feel poorly if one cannot answer them fully. We are a patient class and able to "make haste slowly."
