An exegetical study of Matthew 5-7 with consideration of parallel passages. Special attention to interpretation as well as the influence of the Sermon in the epistles of the New Testament. MDiv prerequisite: NT504. Three hours. Fall, 1993.

 - A. Assignments
 - 1. All Students.
 - a. Read Matthew 5-7 once a week for the guarter
 - Read the commentaries of M. Lloyd Jones and James Boice. I will comment on them in class.
 - 2. English Credit students
 - a. Prepare an analytical outline for the entire sermon
 - b. Prepare two papers, no more than five pages each, from the following suggestions:

--forgiveness in the sermon --prayer in the sermon --significance of the Beattitudes --"casting pearls before swine" --the Golden Rule --reacting to your enemies --judging and the judgment of others.
