March 6, 10	Introduction, explanation, various ramifications including assignments, papers, and class attendance. Sketch of bibliographic materials. Some notes will come on the inductive method of Bible study and there is a chance (!) I will reproduce my own inductive charts on the Sermon.  For the Friday class be sure you have read and understand the Introduction in Guelich.
March 13, 17	The Sermon and its Old Testament Background. Comparative notes in the Synoptics. Advance note of Sermon reference in the rest of the New Testament. The Sermon in various theological systems. Consideration of the context in Matthew. Guelich, chapter II.  Introduction to the Beattitudes.
March 20,	The Beattitudes (but with one "t", sorry, gang) Guelich III.
March 27, 31	The Antithetical segments Guelich IV, V
April 3, 7	The Antithetical segments Guelich VI (pay close attention to Guelich in the literary analysis of these sections...I am not endorsing his concepts but they will give you a clearer understanding of what many modern scholars are doing.)
April 10, 14	Matthew 6 Guelich VII
April 17, 21	Matthew 6 Guelich VIII Special emphasis on the arrangement of the text and its message.
April 28	Matthew 7
May 1, 5	Matthew 7 Guelich IX
May 8, 12	Matthew 7 Guelich X Final analysis. Areas for the application of the sermon, suggestions on preaching and Bible study.
