we are not inventing some passionate deliverance for Biblical ideals...it is a commonly understood study in literature.

b. Internal Marks of Unity

(1) Unity of themes

The idea is that central concepts are found harmonized throughout the work and rather than being
a disjointed accounting of rambled stories,
aspects of truth permeate the various genres of
literature to emphasize key things. One of the
great themes of the Pentateuch is that of <u>deliverance from bondage</u>, i.e., the bondage of sin, slavery, temporal lack, etc. Let your mind reflect
on how this theme is developed in each of the
following sequences:

- --the fall
- -- Cain and Abel
- -- Noahic judgment
- --Selection of Abraham
- --Deliverance of Jacob
- --Release of Israel from Egypt
- --Wilderness events
- --Life of Moses

In all of these accounts you will find common ingredients that tie the accounts together and to the whole. Note these:

- --man's failure and loss
- --God's concern
- --action by a Divine economy
- --reluctance of the recipients to understand
- --necessary rebuke of love
- --position of reassurance
