## I. COURSE OBJECTIVES

## A. General: the student will:

- Gain an understanding of the material needed for the study of the Old Testament.
- Become familiar with the cultural background of the Old Testament.
- Treat questions of criticism and interpretation of the Old Testament.
- Receive information regarding the literature and composition of the Old Testament.

## B. Specific: the student will:

- Study the history and development of the Old Testament text.
- Survey the history of the Old Testament canon and consider canonical questions of Protestant and Orthodox bodies.
- Analyze higher critical aspects of Old Testament criticism.
- Observe the particular characteristics of the literary genre of the Old Testament.
- Become familiar with the fields of study that affect Old Testament interpretation.
- Gain a summary understanding of the theological importance and meaning of the Old Testament.

## II. CONTENT

A survey of materials needed for the study of the Old Testament including higher and lower criticism, analysis of literary materials, supplemental notes in archaeology, Bible geography and history.
