E. What is the Basis for Canonicity

- A number of views may be quickly expressed, views with which we do not agree.
- 2. In our estimation the correct view is that of Divine authorship..that is, that God was the authority behind the books. Keep this in mind and compare with our notes on inspiration. We do not mean that God individually wrote every book or that He uttered every word but that He was the authority behind what was said and done and that consequently the Scripture have with them the very authority of God, Himself.
- Note the Rabbinic expression of "defiling the hands".
