You will see these scattered throughout Archer along with many others.

E. Higher Criticism and the Writings

And we will pick up this somewhat later as well. You will find that the foundational critical ideas are well put in the Pentateuch and modified after that in other ways. But if those basic ideas are understood one can travel a long ways with the other thoughts. And remember this is not a course in criticism but a course in Old Testament introduction and the critical matters are treated only to the extent they are needed in understanding modern thought..an aspect that will be harped upon later!
