E. The Unity of the Pentateuch

1. By definition unity suggests a work that has internal harmony, is marked by a lack of division of style other than the individual traits of genre, and shows an absence of contradictory material. Unity does not mean only one style may be used (an author may work in several genres), that sources are impossible, that only one person did the work. But it does suggest that plan and purpose are complete to the intended extent. There may be some added elements or even an editorial correction or emendation but the essential corps of the literature is homogeneous.
