F. The Sources of the Pentateuch

We will not look for JEDP but do note these sources all of which we think are part of the Mosaic accounting:

- a. Eye Witness materials
- b. Historic records
- c. Direct revelation
- d. Personal accounts of the time but beyond the immediate participation of Moses.
- e. Additions of another inspired writer or so as in the case of Deuteronomy 34...we say it with caution but that is true of a lot of academic things...caution and expression necessarily go hand in hand.

G. The Books of the Pentateuch in fuller perspective
