2. Jeremiah

This is, by word count, the longest book in the Old Testament. IN some ways it is one of the hardest to fully comprehend. But it is the account of a person uniquely called and gifted by God with a powerful challenge to serve in an unusually difficult situation.

a. Theme: Yieldedness to God is the key to everything else.
